Experience in delivering training in-person and virtually is essential, as is experience in producing evidence-informed programming and utilizing a community development approach in the work. We are looking for someone who takes great pride in their work, shows attention to detail, and can work independently and as part of a team. They will bring enthusiasm and strong interpersonal skills to the work.

- 1. Post-secondary degree in a relevant discipline or combination of post-secondary diploma, lived experience and related experience.
- 2. At least three years developing, delivering and evaluating interactive, in-person and digital HIV and/or health-related curricula for adult learners, to support continuing education and professional development.
- 3. Ability to assess the validity of information, and to synthesize and clearly communicate complex information from a variety of sources.
- 4. Ability to think strategically, conceptualize easily, link long-range vision and concepts to daily work, independently exercise good judgment and demonstrate initiative.
